Are You an Undocumented Siskiyou County Resident?

You may be eligible to apply for scholarships from The Ford Family Foundation

Undocumented Siskiyou County residents who meet the following qualifications of California Assembly Bill (AB) 540 are eligible to apply for scholarships from The Ford Family Foundation.

California Assembly Bill (AB) 541 Applicant Eligibility Requirements:

- Attended a California high school for at least three years, or document completing three years of California high school credit and enrollment for at least three years during K-12 in a California school
- Graduated (will graduate) from a California high school or the equivalent
- Complete a California nonresident exemption request if attending a public college in California. (Students attending private institutions must still meet qualifications of AB 540, but will not need to complete a nonresident exemption request)

IN ADDITION:

- Applicants attending a public, 4-year university must complete a **California Nonresident Tuition Exemption Application** (available at university admissions offices) and qualify for in-state tuition
- Complete the California Dream Act Application (CADAA) and save the Student Aid Report showing the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) to your computer as a PDF file.** The EFC is displayed on the California Dream Act confirmation page
- Review Ford Family scholarship criteria at www.tfff.org/scholarships and if eligible, **complete the application by March 1**
