

Ford Transfer Scholars Program

Our Ford Transfer Scholars Program is an undergraduate scholarship available to community college students who work hard, have significant financial need and are ready to transfer to a four-year college. Up to 25 renewable scholarships are awarded each year to students from Oregon and Siskiyou County, California.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Be a resident of Oregon or Siskiyou County, California, and meet all in-state residency requirements for college of attendance
- Be under the age of 25 by March 1 of the application year
- Be a current community college student or recent graduate (within the last academic year) of an accredited community college in their home state of Oregon or California
- Be prepared to transfer to a four-year college with the goal of earning a bachelor's degree (and have not previously earned a bachelor's degree)
- Enroll fall of application year, attending full-time, on campus at a federally financial aid-eligible public or private (nonprofit) college, based in their home state of Oregon or California*
- Face significant barriers—financial and otherwise—to attending college
- Complete a financial aid application (FAFSA, ORSAA or CADAA)
- Eligible undocumented students are welcome to apply
- If a felony conviction in their past, satisfy the terms of the conviction by August 1 of the application year

*Residents of Siskiyou County may attend Oregon Institute of Technology or Southern Oregon University if they qualify for in-state tuition. Online college education programs do not qualify.



Scholarships include a renewable financial award of up to \$40,000 per year.

The actual award amount is calculated based on several factors, including the student's financial need, the Cost of Attendance at their college of choice and additional scholarships received.

Ford Transfer Scholars who successfully complete their bachelor's degree may be eligible to apply for up to two years of graduate-level support.

Demonstrate responsibility and initiative in skill-building and learning through experiences such as paid or unpaid work



Motivation and mindset

Believe success comes from one's ability to grow and learn; rise to challenges and persist despite obstacles; willing to ask for help and utilize resources
