Are You an Undocumented Siskiyou County Resident?

Undocumented Siskiyou County residents who meet the following qualifications of California Assembly Bill (AB) 540 are eligible to apply for scholarships from The Ford Family Foundation.

California Assembly Bill (AB) 540 Applicant Eligibility Requirements:

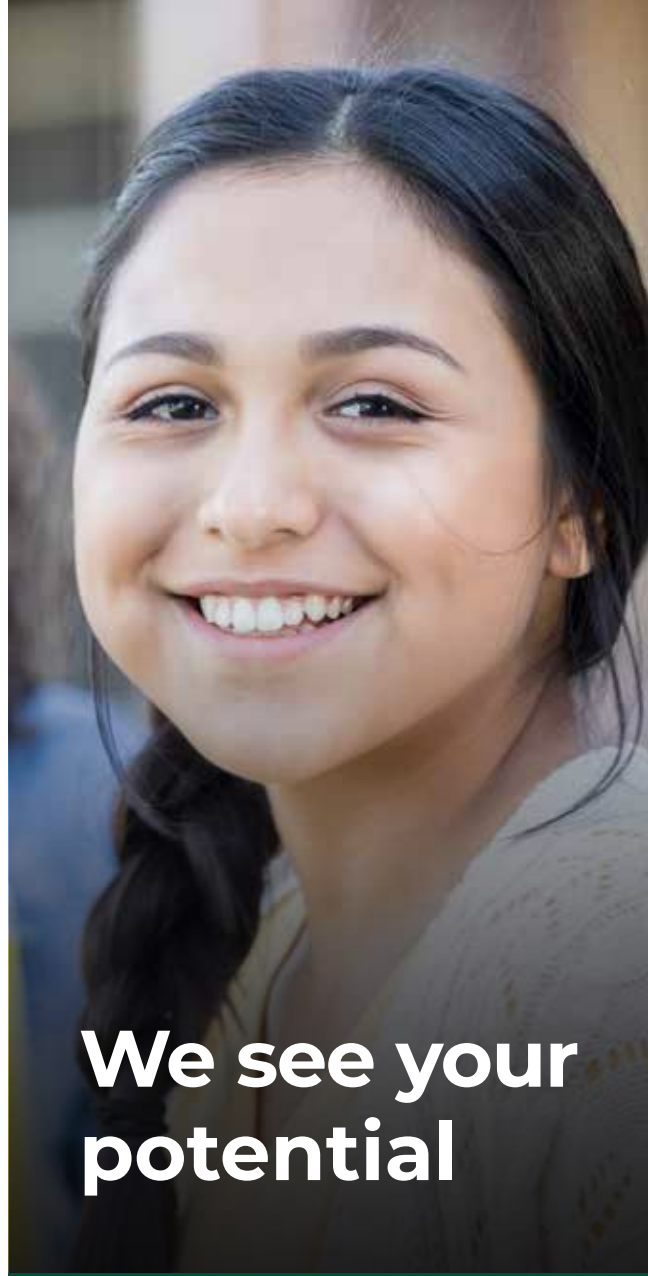
- Attended a California high school for at least three years
- Received (or will receive) a high school diploma or GED in California
- Certifies intention to become a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident

In Addition:

- ❑ **Applicants attending a public, four-year college must complete California Nonresident Tuition Exemption Application** (available at university admissions offices) and qualify for in-state tuition. Students attending private institutions must still meet qualifications but may not need to complete a nonresident exemption request.
- ❑ **Be eligible for and complete the 2026-27 California Dream Act Application (CADAA)** as soon as possible after it opens and save the confirmation page. You will need to save this file to your computer as a PDF file in order to upload it to your application by March 2.
- ❑ As part of the selection process, select applicants may be asked to complete The Ford Family Foundation's **Tuition Equity form to certify they meet all of the above eligibility criteria.** Scholarship offers may be rescinded if an applicant does not meet all criteria and/or does not qualify for in-state tuition.
- ❑ Review Ford Family scholarship criteria at www.tfff.org/scholarships and if eligible, **complete the application by March 2.**
